#### 7. Disney inspired shooting stars

This is excellent CPD and free resources are given to each school who sign up.

#### 8. Training Day girls football

Abbeyfield School – 4 girls from each school, year 5 only. They will be trained on how to run a football club so that they can become your Football Ambassadors. This is a drop and go event.

#### 9. Fencing - Neil Bromley

Neil can deliver an 11 week programme using booklets that relate to healthy lifestyle. The first 4 weeks are free, the 7 remaining sessions are Go Fence sessions. Stickers and trophies are given throughout the course. It is aimed at year 5's. Year 4's can access but it is more of a struggle. Mini fence is available for younger pupils and they will start with foam swords and transition to plastic.

At the end they will get a badge and certificate. Pupils are also given a free 4 weeks at Swindon Fencing Academy.

Costings are £900 – 1000 for the full 11 weeks. It works out less than £2 per session for those with 2 class entry.

PLTs had the opportunity to take part in some fencing to see it in action!
